



Scottish Association of Blind Bowlers (S.A.B.B.)



Bowling for the blind and partially Sighted (P.S.) was started in the late 1940's or early 50's by the Scottish War-blinded based at Lynburn House, West Lothian, where a bowling green was part of the recreational facilities provided for the men. In my capacity as Welfare Officer for the Blind in Fife, I founded a bowling club for my clients in 1958. At around that same time, three other areas in Scotland also created bowling clubs for their areas. In the summer of 1959, the first tournament for the Scottish Blind Bowlers was held at Baxter Park Dundee, when the following teams took part: Dundee, Edinburgh, Renfrew, Fife and the Scottish War-blinded, who on that occasion took the trophy. The S.A. B.B. was founded later that year. From these early beginnings around 20 clubs in Scotland are enjoying the sport, which has developed both nationally and internationally and will reach a pinnacle in the year 2001 when The World Blind Championships will be held at Girvan in Ayrshire. So the doubts and criticisms received in the early days about even considering bowling for the blind and partially sighted have proved to be unfounded.
